

About two dozen mint condition copies of Robie Tufts' 1973 edition of The Birds of Nova Scotia, with dust jackets and in their original boxes, will become available for purchase this autumn. These books were set aside by the N. S. Museum in 1973 for use as gifts; they will now be released for sale to the public through the Nova Scotia Bird Society. This definitive work on Nova Scotia birds has been out of print since 1977, and is considered a collector's item.

The method of sale will be like that used to distribute moose hunting licences. A draw will be conducted by NSBS at a public event at the Museum in November; winners gain the right to purchase a book for \$40.00
