NOVA SCOTIA'S MIGRATION COUNT

Nova Scotia's Migration Bird Count (NSMC) will be held this year on **May 10**. This is the count's 16th consecutive year. It provides us a snapshot into the well-being, population trends, and seasonal migration patterns of our birds. This is even more relevant given the apparent change in our continental weather patterns.

Participation is easy; simply contact a county or regional coordinator, obtain the forms, and then walk or drive your assigned area, watch feeders, or listen on owl routes. 


2007 Puffin of the Year Award

- 1. He's been birding since he was 9 years old
- 2. He's an atlasser on both the current and the previous Maritime Breeding Bird Atlas
- 3. He is a Past President of the Nova Scotia Bird Society
- 4. He's a field trip leader
- 5. He's a Seasonal Editor for "Nova Scotia Birds"
- 6. He's a member of the NS Bird Records Committee
- 7. He's a Christmas Bird Count organizer and compiler.

In fact, I've been told he once waded into hip-deep snow to try to flush a Snowy Owl for a CBC. Many birders have commented that he and a close friend of his can often be seen traipsing into virtually impassable terrain in search of an elusive bird!

He's written numerous papers and letters in support of habitat conservation; even urging the Nature Conservancy of Canada to preserve more areas of Brier Island, a place that has special significance for him. He has helped compile a species list for Brier Island; and on a personal note, he's given me some excellent advice with regards to Society business at a time when I most needed it.



In Memorium – Eric H. Cooke. 6th August 1921 - 10th January 2008

Eric Cooke, former president of the Nova Scotia Bird Society (1971) and a long-time keen supporter of, and a contributer to the Society's many activities, died suddenly on 10th January 2008 while visiting his beloved country cottage at Lower La Have, Lunenburg County. He was 86 years old.

Eric was a tireless birder in the province for about 50 years, regularly providing reliable, careful identification of the province's breeding birds and rare visiting species. He was the faithful compiler of the Broad Cove Christmas Bird Count for over 30 years.

While he was president, he instituted the annual "Puffin of the Year Award" to be awarded to a person who had given outstanding service to the Bird Society. The first recipient was Dr. Phyllis Dobson, editor of the quarterly magazine. Eric made the presentation in 1971 at a weekend field trip at Briar Island.

He was born in Armdale, 6th August 1921, a son of the late Arthur H. and Daisy (Gilbert) Cooke, and attended Halifax Academy. In 1939, he started to work for Imperial Oil Limited. The job was short-lived. Within months, World War 2 began that year, and Eric volunteered to serve in the Royal Canadian Air Force. He was trained as a pilot before being posted to the Royal Air Force in Burma in the Far East, where he survived "a few near misses and lucky escapes." Known as a reliable and lucky Flying Officer he continued serving until hostilities ended in 1945.

Once back in Canada he returned to Imperial Oil, and worked with his old company for the rest of his working days. Then he found freedom in retirement, bird watching throughout the province in earnest, going ever further afield, exploring the NSBS sanctuary islands, always sure-footed and willing to be deployed through thickets and deep marshes. He also spent time encouraging young bird watchers in Nova Scotia's and fostering their interest in habitat and wildlife.

In his mid-60s, he encountered a former childhood acquaintance, Ruth Ballem, a fearless and talented equestrian full of spunk and sparkle. Until then, bird watching and gardening at his beloved 6 acres in Lower LaHave, Lunenburg County, had been essential pastimes in Eric's life. Suddenly, a new vitality took place.

Eric would shop at book stores, return home with travel guides, and announce, "I've been thinking." Together, he and Ruth, his spouse of these past 20 years, embarked on travels and adventures to distant places: they went river rafting in Colorado; skydiving; hot air ballooning; bird watching in the upper Amazon; white water rafting in Australia; spent weeks camping in New Zealand; and, eschewing travel agents, they hired a van and roughed it on their own in Costa Rica. They went to Peru, sailed along the Panama Canal bird watching, and went into the outback of Australia.

Their later years had erupted into pleasures and adventures neither had previously anticipated. Eric is survived by his spouse, Ruth W. Ballem, Halifax, and his sister, Audrey E. Barton, East LaHave. He was predeceased by his brother, Arthur in 1968.

N.S. Birders Are Putting Their Passion for Birding on the Map

Ask the average person what they plan to do this summer and the response will likely be something along the lines of, "go to the beach" or "put in a new deck". However, ask a birder how they plan to spend their summer vacation and they'll likely tell you that they "are going to finish their square" or "bump up their number of confirmations." What is this strange language you ask? It is the language of the Maritimes Breeding Bird Atlas volunteer and there are more than 700 of them out there, combing the Maritimes, looking for evidence of breeding birds.

The Maritimes Breeding Bird Atlas is a five-year, volunteer-based project to determine the distribution, abundance and status of all birds breeding in NB, NS and PEI. A first Maritimes Breeding Bird Atlas was conducted between 1986 and 1990, and the resulting publication (a book describing breeding bird distribution with maps and text) has been heavily relied on by environmental consultants, policy makers, researchers and wildlife managers to delineate areas of conservation priority and make effective conservation decisions. Today, this first Atlas is still the most comprehensive and up-to-date source of breeding bird distribution information for most Maritimes bird species.

But over the past twenty years land-use patterns and other environmental factors have changed and these changes have inevitably affected bird distribution and abundance as well. Current information is needed to direct future conservation policy and protect critical habitat for our Maritimes bird species. Field work for the second Maritimes Breeding Bird Atlas began in the spring of 2006 and will continue through 2010. Already, volunteers have spent an astounding 17,000 hours surveying for breeding birds and more than 74,000 individual bird records have been submitted to the online database (36,500 of those records are from NS—thank-you to all who have dedicated so much time and effort to the project!).

So how does the Atlas work? The entire Maritimes have been divided into 1,774, 10 by 10 km, squares which volunteers systematically survey, spending a minimum of 20 hours in each square, searching for breeding birds and covering all habitat types. Participants record all bird species, as well as, all breeding evidence observed. Breeding evidence ranges from a bird singing in suitable nesting habitat during the breeding season (considered evidence of "possible" breeding) to finding a nest with eggs ("confirmed" breeding). Up-to-date species and effort maps, plus real-time data summaries, are available online (www. mba-aom.ca) and enable participants to see where different bird species have been found and which squares have been surveyed. Following the project's completion in 2010, the website will continue to be maintained and will serve as an extensive database of breeding bird information that can be queried for numerous research, conservation and educational purposes.

Already many stories are beginning to unfold, from new breeding records (e.g., Purple Gallinule, Sandhill Crane, and Le Conte's Sparrow) to distributional changes. Turkey Vultures, which were recorded as "possible" breeders in 7 squares during the first atlas, have been detected throughout NB and 3 Turkey Vulture nests were found in 2007! The Yellow-throated Vireo, previously detected in one square during the first Atlas, has been found in all three Maritimes provinces. Palm Warblers, which breed in bogs and other areas with low conifers, were absent from northwestern NB during the first Atlas. This time around, they've been found breeding in many northern NB squares. Other species are showing signs of population declines. Barn Swallows have been detected in 42% less in squares already surveyed squares in comparison with the first Atlas. And some rarities, like the Loggerhead Shrike, Louisiana Waterthrush and Sedge Wren (all detected during the first Atlas) are still waiting to be found.

However, these stories are just the beginning and, over the next three years as more volunteers finish surveying their squares, many more stories are sure to develop. Of course, it's not too late to join this important conservation effort. Loons Through Grebes

The birds in this section would seem to be under-reported, perhaps because the weather has generally been less than ideal for viewing from exposed locations. Coastal study is greatly hampered by a combination of unfavorable winds, gloomy skies and breaking waves. We seem to have had more than our share of that this fall. The grebes especially are hard to find under those conditions.

RED-THROATED LOONS with their white, fall, throats often illustrate just what can be missed. When the sun breaks through you can suddenly see several where none were visible a few minutes before. All the numbers of these birds seem to have been concentrated in the Pictou to Antigonish region this year. COMMON LOON results seem particularly sparse with amazingly few reports. Again the only real numbers were in the Pictou to Antigonish zone of the Province.

The few reports on the diminutive PIED-BILLED GREBE were widely scattered with none coming from the CB area. The much more social HORNED GREBE showed up in the greatest numbers. CJF reported "reasonable numbers" on Mahone Bay, KJM found Horned Grebes in several bays on the Eastern Shore and a few at Big I. in *Pictou*. The RED-NECKED GREBE was also widely dispersed about the Province, though KJM reported "a good number" at Big I., *Pictou*. ¤

Tubenoses Through Cormorants

A **YELLOW-NOSED ALBATROSS** flew directly over a whale research vessel in the open Atlantic due S of Liverpool May 26, the fourth record of this spectacular seabird within NS waters. Details are on their way to the Nova Scotia Bird Records Committee.

Although they are seldom seen from shore, IAM's report from a research cruise to Roseway Basin, off southern NS between Brown's Bank and CSI, shows that NORTHERN FULMARS can be abundant offshore quite early in the season - he recorded

80 (8-10 of which were dark phase) Sept. 13-14, along with other expectable species, including both common shearwaters, one CORY'S SHEARWATER, a few Storm-Petrels of both species, a few Phalaropes of both species, a Pomarine and a Parasitic Jaeger, and a few Atlantic Puffins.

Some spectacular seabird flypasts were reported this fall. During the first, observed from Northern Point, Brier I. Sept. 4, during strong westerly winds, at least 10,000 GREATER SHEARWATERS, a few hundred SOOTY SHEARWATERS and two MANX SHEARWATERS were accompanied by five Parasitic Jaegers, Atlantic Puffins, Black-legged Kittiwakes and a Razorbill. Off Chebucto Hd., Sept. 16, were 250 Greater Shearwaters, 12 Sooty Shearwaters, two Cory's Shearwaters (details would be appreciated of this species), 25 WILSON'S and 2 LEACH'S STORM-PETRELS, 100 NORTHERN GANNETS, one Parasitic and 12 Pomarine Jaegers, three Black-legged Kittiwakes, and 46 Common Terns.

NORTHERN GANNET numbers from late October through late November off the whole southern coast of the province and in the Canso Strait and Georges Bay regions, as the birds follow schools of migrating fish, are among the wonders of the fall migration.

DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANTS carry out an extended migration through our coastal waters during September and October, but CAM and ALM's observations in coastal *CBRM*, carried out during a Whimbrel survey, show that the migration may start in early August.

Just after the passage of post-tropical storm *Noel*, Nov. 4, a frigatebird was seen off Rainbow Haven Bch., *HRM*. Although it was likely a **MAGNIFICENT FRIGATEBIRD**, at the time of writing information was not available to eliminate the possibility of Great and Lesser Frigatebird, both of which have been recorded from central and eastern North America. \square


## Herons

## Geese, Swans and Ducks

For many people in Nova Scotia, this fall was an opportunity to fill in several gaps in the waterfowl sections of their life-lists. There were several notable visitors and, for the most part, they cooperated by staying around for a while in reasonably accessible locations.

A GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE (11th NS record) was first reported by the team of DOU and FLL in a huge flock of CANADA GEESE in a field near Truro. As a **BARNACLE GOOSE** (3rd NS record) was identified at the same time, this was enough to cause a large number of observers to descend on the area. Arriving the very next day was IAM, and he rapidly identified two **CACKLING GEESE** (5th and 6th records) in the same general mob of birds. This guaranteed even more attention to the region, and the reports flowed thick and fast as many birders got into the action. A few days later Ian identified a SNOW GOOSE in the same flocks, adding to the excitement.

This whole thing became a real spectacle with up to 2000 Canada Geese being reported in the area, observers having to examine this huge volume of birds in order to find the rarities hidden among them. They had lots of time; the Greater White-fronted Goose was reported regularly from Oct. 15-28. Perhaps fatigue set in by then, but there were few reports after that time. However DAM observed a bird in the same area as late as Nov. 23, presumably the same one. The Barnacle Goose was seen almost daily until Nov. 1 and one of the Cackling Geese was still there until Nov. 5. The Snow Goose remained until at least Nov. 1.

Included in this large flock of Canada Geese were some smaller and darker variants. IAM speculated that they were either Baffin I. or Greenland type of the interior subspecies. The Greater White-fronted Goose also appeared to have a Greenland origin and the Barnacle Goose would fit the same scenario as it breeds in Greenland.

Province wide, Canada Geese were reported almost daily, widely spread and in extremely large numbers. It looks as if they are becoming the waterfowl version of the Crow!


Almost lost in all this concern about unusual geese were reports about BRANT. Blake Maybank was able to identify two flying low over the water at Wagner's Beach, Prospect – no others were reported. I am not sure whether to conclude that they were actually missing or that people were otherwise engaged and simply didn't record them.

Another Snow Goose spent time on Brier I. at Big Pond, being identified by CAH Oct. 15 and for a week after that. CAH also found a Snow Goose at the same location Nov. 4, presumably the same individual.

Among the ducks, an uncommon winter sighting of a REDHEAD was made at Red Bridge Pond in Dartmouth and an excellent photo was obtained by BBU. It was hanging out with a flock of RING-NECKED DUCKS. The Redhead's occurrence was unusual enough to warrant a mention in the Halifax Daily News. The ring-necks, unusual in themselves, were largely ignored in all the fuss. GADWALLS, still uncommon, were seen in small numbers well outside their normal location of the Amherst region. Perhaps they are slowly becoming established in HRM.

BBU was able to photograph a EURASIAN WIGEON during its stay at Sullivans Pond in Dartmouth. AMERICAN WIGEONS were quite widely reported with some surprising numbers showing up. In comparison, the numbers of LONG-TAILED DUCKS are considerably less than I would have expected.

RUDDY DUCKS, normally considered to be quite rare at this time of year were seen in both the Windsor area and in Dartmouth on extended visits. Again, this gave the "listers" among us an opportunity to add to their totals. ¤

The big prize was a "twitchable" BARNACLE GOOSE (upper left, Oct. 21), which, although its age was debated, had a weakly creamy face and faint flank bars suggestive of an adult. Equally sought were two or three CACKLING GEESE (upper right, Oct. 24) with marks of the Nunavut-breeding *hutchinsii*. There were also a GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE (lower right, Oct. 28), which had the large white forehead patch and extensive ventral barring extending to the belly (as in the Greenland subspecies, for which its orange bill colour is less reliable) and, least exciting, a (Greater) SNOW GOOSE (lower left, Oct. 24). Note variations among the accompanying CANADA GEESE, including small, thin-necked, dark ones that may hail from the northernmost breeding populations of in Canada and W. Greenland. What were probably these same birds appeared in MA in late October, later in NY and DE, and again returned north to MA in January. Time will tell if sightings of Black Vultures will increase in years to come as they have in recent years for its close relative the TURKEY VULTURE.

The report of an ad. PEREGRINE FALCON accompanied by a begging imm. from the Canning area in early August could be an indication for a successful nesting season nearby. Given frequent sightings of more than one peregrine in the Halifax/ Dartmouth area I wouldn't be surprised to learn about nesting attempts in the urban environment (the grain elevators come to mind).^a

## Shorebirds

#### **By Susann Myers**

The fall season brought the usual bounty of shorebirds, with almost all species reported on schedule and in average to highaverage numbers, with exceptions noted below. Many species also lingered into November in above-average numbers. Reduced reporting from CSI made trends for some species difficult to assess, although JON's report of *ca*. 20,000 shorebirds there Aug. 5 indicates a good season.

AMERICAN GOLDEN-PLOVERS were first reported approximately two weeks later than average and, although widely distributed, were seen in low numbers except for a concentration at Sydney airport. Increased monitoring at short-grass habitats such as airfields, golf courses and sod farms would give a more accurate picture of this generally uncommon fall migrant. Few PIPING PLOVERS were noted, but two unusually late individuals were reported: one unbanded juv. Oct. 5-6 and one with an injured leg Nov. 18.

**AMERICAN AVOCETS** have been annual since 2004, with this year's individual enjoyed by many observers during its twoweek stay at Brier I. and environs. A late report was received of a sighting by B. Drucker at Prospect High Hd., Aug. 8, 2006. AMERICAN OYSTERCATCHERS departed on schedule, with only two lingering to Sept. 23.

SPOTTED SANDPIPERS were widespread and in good numbers, following what appears to have been a good breeding season. Four juvs. noted in Three Fathom Hbr. Aug. 5 were from separate nestings, with two half-grown and two only a day or so posthatch. Most unusually, no ads. were present to raise alarms. A concentration of eight SOLITARY SANDPIPERS noted in Middleton was also unusual.

GREATER YELLOWLEGS were, as usual, most common along the Atlantic coast, particularly at Morien Bar in CB, the extensive saltmarshes of the Eastern shore, and of course CSI. The main concentrations of ad. WILLETS are typically seen in mid- to late-July, with juvs. following by early August; the large concentration noted at CSI in early August fits this pattern. As usual, the bulk of LESSER YELLOWLEGS migrated through in July, although this year brought an unusually high number of lingerers in September.

WHIMBREL are coastal migrants and were reported in good numbers, particularly in CB, where CAM and AAM's daily watch of migrants arriving onshore at Schooner Pond produced very impressive numbers. Unfortunately, there were no reports of numbers from CSI, another favoured site. HUDSONIAN GODWIT numbers grew in August after the first arrivals in July, but remained at only about half of average. **MARBLED GODWITS**, which have become almost annual in August-September, were spotted at two locations.

The endangered *rufa* subspecies of RED KNOT migrates through NS on its way to Tierra del Fuego in July to early September. Numbers were once again low, with the only concentrations noted at Morien Bar. The later-migrating subspecies that overwinters in North and Central America was present in fairly good numbers in September to November, however, at preferred sites. SANDERLINGS, which typically arrive late from their high-arctic breeding grounds, were reported in below-average numbers, with the exception of an unusually high early count of 950 at CSI. The sandflats of CSI are critical to this species in NS, with typical peaks there about 10 times the number at other favoured sites.

SEMIPALMATED SANDPIPERS had a very good showing at the Minas Basin, but numbers were low away from the Bay of Fundy. Two well-documented reports were received of **WESTERN SANDPIPERS**, which are rare transients in NS. BAIRD'S SANDPIPERS, which typically migrate through the interior of North America and are uncommon on the coast, were noted at about twice the average number. PECTORAL SANDPIPERS were widespread but in very low numbers, with no concentrations reported.

There are typically few sightings of PURPLE SANDPIPERS in fall. The only reports received were from Duncans Cove where a good-sized flock built up by the end of November. DUNLIN, which are late migrants, were reported in very good numbers, peaking on schedule in late October and lingering into November in unusually high numbers.

STILT SANDPIPERS are annual in small numbers and are most numerous from August to early September, along favoured marshy edges; this year's total of eight were average and on schedule. By contrast, BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPERS were seen in unprecedented numbers. Twenty-eight were widely scattered, all but one along the Atlantic coast; this was more than twice the average seasonal total. The additional 50 reported from the Shearwater airfields made this a banner year.

An ad. **REEVE** staged for six weeks, moving between shallow saltwater coves in Three Fathom/Lower Three Fathom Hbr. Typically approachable, it provided close looks during its moult of head and body feathers from worn breeding plumage with internal markings to fresh non-breeding plumage with crisp, buffy fringes and no internal markings on mantle, scapulars and wing coverts. All of which fails to convey the excitement of watching this transformation, which normally takes place in Europe or Africa, from a cove on the Eastern Shore.

SHORT-BILLED DOWITCHERS, whose migration through NS peaked in July, were still noted in good numbers in August. **LONG-BILLED DOWITCHERS** were reported only from CSI, but two possible long-billeds, seen at too great a distance to identify, were found at the Windsor Sewage Ponds in mid- to late-October (AAM, RBS) and Cole Hbr. Oct. 27 (SEM).

WILSON'S PHALAROPES are interior migrants, occurring annually in NS in only ones and twos, and occasionally small groups, such as the three found in Port Mouton by RES. RED-NECKED and RED PHALAROPES were seen in good numbers off Brier I., where JUS wrote of "flocks of phalaropes ... like clouds of silver". Tens of thousands were reported Sept. 3, and it was noted that the ratio at sea the previous day had been 10:1 Red to Red-necked. The migration of Red-neckeds, which is earlier than for Reds and extends from early July to early September, is typically most concentrated off NB.[¤]

## **Gulls Through Alcids**

#### **By Eric Mills**

A second-year LITTLE GULL took up residence among the BLACK-HEADED and BONAPARTE GULLS at Conrads Bch. and the Lawrencetown L. area, HRM, Aug. 18- ca. Sept. 14, and was ticked by many. At least two of the Bonaparte's Gulls were in the rather seldom seen early, juvenile plumage, providing a convenient comparison.

The only MEW (COMMON) GULL of the season, reported without details, was in the Aspy Bay region, Vic., region Oct. 10.

LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULLS no longer deserve "rare" status, but it is noteworthy that records increased in late September and that among the birds seen from Sept. 24 through Oct. 11 in the Grand Pré area, Kings, was a darker mantled adult that is likely to have been Larus fuscus intermedius (from coastal northwestern Europe) rather than the expected Icelandic and British L. f. graellsii. This, with the observation in June in the Dartmouth area of an even darker bird that may have come from the Baltic, of the race (maybe full species) L. f. fuscus, makes looking at these dark-mantled gulls unusually interesting.

The first GLAUCOUS GULL of the season appeared at a pizza-joint in Glace Bay, Oct. 20, a site it is frequenting for the second winter. As CAM and ALM noted, "we think he owns the place." Last year it was in residence until late May.

The recent pattern of fairly frequent CASPIAN TERNS in the fall was maintained again this year and a very late ARCTIC TERN was off Cabot Landing P.P., Vic., during the first week of October.

A GREAT SKUA, reported from a whale-watching cruise off Brier I., Aug. 27, still has not been documented, despite the rarity of that species (especially inshore) at any season and the greater likelihood of South Polar Skua on that date and in that location.

A "large group of 10-15 jaegers that were gray above and darkish below" off Chebucto Hd., *HRM*, Oct. 20, was believed to be made up of ad. LONG-TAILED JAEGERS. An imm. was on Sable I. at the end of August.^a

Its mantle tone matched Yellow-legged Gull, *Larus michahellis*, of the Azores subspecies *atlantis*. However, the head streaking was much more extensive; streaking on *atlantis* always shows a distinct cutoff above the nape, giving it a hooded appearance. ## **Pigeon Through Woodpeckers**

Unexpected visitors were ROCK PIGEONS at SLH's Tremont, *Kings*, feeder in November and three MOURNING DOVES in BES's yard in Glace Bay.

YELLOW-BILLED CUCKOOS far outnumbered BLACK-BILLED CUCKOOS this fall, given the large number of sightings of the former. The first sighting of the Yellow-billed Cuckoo matched the date from 2005, and the last sighting was by RMA the day after the storm Noel.

There were a number of owl sightings for "backyard lists". RFL had BARRED OWL and NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWLS in his yard. A co-worker of Gayle MacLean photographed a Northern-Saw-whet Owl that had struck a window. Fortunately the bird was stunned only long enough for the picture to be taken. ELM occasionally heard LONG-EARED OWLS on Brier I. this fall and FLL *et al.* heard one during the NSBS Brier I. weekend. JCT reported sightings of three SHORT-EARED OWLS a month apart in the Canard River Valley, *Kings*.

Many observers saw large (given their threatened status) congregations of migrating COMMON NIGHTHAWKS. There were no August report of CHIMNEY SWIFTS other than the "chimney roost" sightings by KJM and JWW *et al.* The notes from KJM denoted Chimney Swifts flying around but not entering the chimney roost towards the end of August.

There was a flurry of RUBY-THROATED HUMMINGBIRD reports in early September after MFU expressed surprise at still seeing hummingbirds around. From the middle of September the majority of reports of Ruby-throated hummingbirds were of last sightings around yards and/or feeders. Margaret Millard was sitting near her window Oct. 3 when "I saw a blaze of copper at my hummingbird feeder". This turned out to be the sun hitting the feathers of a **RUFOUS HUMMINGBIRD**. Margaret was sure there were two birds initially in her yard, one an all-rufous one which indicated an adult, and another which ELM and DPO saw the next day (Oct. 4), an imm. male which had rufous color on its head and lower back only. Unfortunately this Rufous Hummingbird took its last sip at her feeders at 8:15 AM (Oct. 6) just before a group of birders arrived. The Rufous Hummingbird is a very rare vagrant (only 10 records since 1950).

Susan Hunt had a female RED-BELLIED WOODPECKER in her yard from Oct. 14 to the end of this report period. Two years ago during the same time period she had a male Red-bellied woodpecker. There were two sightings of Red-bellied Woodpecker in Glace Bay. In early October BES and GEC had one in their yard and in late November, JUM had one in his yard. A nice find by CSS, CLS and FLL in Onslow during the goose extravaganza was a RED-HEADED WOODPECKER. A few others were lucky enough to see this bird. There was a big fallout day in CSI Oct. 7 and FLL and DOU reported 10 YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKERS from CSI.

During the first week of August a visiting ornithologist, Haven Wiley, saw an AMERICAN THREE-TOED WOODPECKER fly across the road somewhere between Port Hood and Mabou, *Inv*. The following week DOM spotted one in Ingonish, *Vic*. The American three-toed woodpecker is a rare resident. There were large numbers of migrating NORTHERN FLICKERS during the first week of October. About 50 were reported by ELM on Brier I. and 40 or more were reported by KJM *et al.* on Seal I.. There were a couple of sightings of PILEATED WOODPECKERS from yards. ¤

## **Flycatchers Through Thrushes**

TOK was stalking WESTERN KINGBIRDS in Canso Town, *Guys.*, Sept. 18 and he was successful in finding a group of two at the Sports Complex and then a group of three more perched on wires in front of his house. He subsequently found a second group of Western Kingbirds and with them, a **SAY'S PHOEBE**, another western bird, and striking in its earth tone colours.

The birders on the NSBS field trip to Brier I. Sept. 30 were delighted to spot a GREAT CRESTED FLYCATCHER at Northern Point. DAM found another one at Duncans Cove, *HRM*, Oct. 30. This elegant and feisty bird breeds in Nova Scotia but is hard to find in its tree-top haunts. There are no confirmed recent breeders (MBBA).


The numerous Western Kingbird reports from Canso Town, *Guys.*, Duncans Cove, *HRM*, Second Peninsula, *Lun*, and CSI to Brier I. suggest that these birds migrate along the Atlantic Ocean coastline. This aggressive bird was observed chasing a NORTHERN SHRIKE in Canso Town, *Guys*.

The WHITE-EYED VIREO, a rare migrant, has become an annual visitor in recent years. Like the Western Kingbird it appears to follow the coastline with reports from Canso Town, *Guys.*, Hartlen Pt., *HRM*, and Duncans Cove, *HRM*.

There were two reports of a YELLOW-THROATED VIREO. One was at CSI, Oct. 1 (MUN) and the other one was on Seal I., Sept. 2 (ABO). This rare migrant often travels alone. There is one unconfirmed, recent nest site (MBBA).

We seldom get photos of late Empidonax flycatchers that are sufficient to consider farwestern rarities. This collage of one Oct. 19 at Canso, allows it to be distinguished as a LEAST FLYCATCHER from the similarly chunky, small-billed and short tailed HAMMOND'S (Dusky being longer-billed, longer tailed). Unlike most Hammonds Flycatchers at this time of year, it has moulted most tertials and coverts. Its short bill is not narrow and straight-sided; the eye-ring not markedly teardrop-shaped and, finally, and the primary extension is short - o.k. for Least and Dusky, but too short for Hammond's.. Refining this, note that the 5th primary is about the same length as the 6th – the latter would be notably shorter in the two westerners. [Photos Tom Kavanaugh]



Numerous reports of WARBLING VIREO and PHILADELPHIA VIREO, both uncommon migrants, suggest the same coastal migration pattern as other vireos with reports from Glace Bay, Canso Town, *Guys.*, Halifax area, Conrads I., *Lun*, CSI, Brier I. to Seal I. The Warbling Vireo has one confirmed nest site (MBBA) whereas the Philadelphia Vireo has none (MBBA).

The NSBS annual field trip to Brier I., Sept. 30, witnessed an assemblage of over 200 BLUE JAYS. ELM reported another 200 plus Blue Jays, Oct. 1, including 50 at a single feeder on the island. The HORNED LARK is usually an uncommon migrant but this was not the case this year with numerous reports all along the Atlantic coastline.

There was only one report of PURPLE MARTIN at Prospect Village, *HRM*, Aug. 25, by Peter Browne, so another year passes by without any reports of nesting in Nova Scotia. Also, the latest data from the MBBA shows no nesting activity in Nova Scotia or Prince Edward Island with only two confirmed locations in New Brunswick.

The ad. fem. **VIOLET-GREEN SWALLOW** is very similar to the Tree Swallow in appearance but is more closely related to the Golden and Bahama Swallows of the Caribbean area. This western Canadian bird breeds west of Manitoba and is extremely rare here as a migrant. BLM and Peter Browne were birding the Prospect area, *HRM*, near Wagners Bch., Aug. 30, when they spotted what they initially thought was a TREE SWALLOW. Their suspicions were aroused however, when the bird's call notes sounded atypical for a Tree Swallow.

In BLM'S words, "I heard an odd call note above me, and looked up and saw a swallow coursing back and forth just above the beach. In shape and size it resembled a Tree Swallow, and that is what I thought it was at first, but it repeated the odd call note, which didn't sound at all like a Tree Swallow, so we looked more closely.

The fog muted the colours on the bird, so the back colour was hard to determine, but as the bird flew past us I could see what appeared to be a white rump. On another pass by the bird, when I looked more carefully, there was actually a fine dark line down the middle of the rump, so what I had thought was a white rump was actually white "saddles" that almost met in the middle of the rump. I called out to Peter that I thought this was a Violet-green Swallow, and we both looked intently. On some passes the bird was too high, and features were obscured by fog, but it often flew by quite low, so that we could eventually make out a white face on the bird, with white above the eye. The underparts were crisp white, and the upperparts dark green. If the upperparts were emerald-green this might have been muted by the fog, but I think the bird was female, which tend to be darker than males." This is the third record for Nova Scotia.

Our resident RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH population has fallen in recent years but the bird is now back in strength with numerous reports coming in from all over the province, including Sable I. Several groupings were observed including a flock of 70 at Northern Pt., Brier I., Sept. 5 (ELM). Reports of WHITE-BREASTED NUTHATCHS are increasing as well. There were over 20 in Canso Town, *Guys.*, Oct. 9 (TOK). The two nuthatch species sometimes migrate together so seeing dozens of them side by side on a single tree is a sight to behold.

A **CAROLINA WREN** was a reliable daily feeder visitor at DOE and Eric Ensor's place in Ohio, *Shel*. It arrived circa Oct. 11, and remained into the winter (JAH). There is one recent atlas record, an unmated male singing on territory in Indian Harbour in 2006. (MBBA).

There were ten reports of **HOUSE WREN** and seven reports of **MARSH WREN** in various locations. These wrens are usually rare autumn migrants.

It was also a good year for BLUE-GRAY GNATCATCHER with ten reports from eight diverse locations including Chebucto Hd., *HRM*.

An immature **NORTHERN WHEATEAR** was observed by the NSBS field trip, Sept. 30, on Brier I. This cooperative bird was sunning itself atop the giant wooden mushroom in front of the lodge. ¤

## **Mimics Through Warblers**

GRAY CATBIRDS were reported in normal numbers this fall and NORTERN MOCKINGBIRD numbers continue on the low side. A spring report of BROWN THRASHER is included for Sable I. For yet another year there is a record of breeding Brown Thrashers, this time due to the diligent observations of HAT in Portuguese Cove. In his research, HAT noted that thrashers often become silent after a breeding pair has bonded and relocated to a nesting location. Thus his yard observations of a single thrasher earlier this past spring could have been either a male or a female with the other parent left protecting the nest. August 21, HAT observed and photographed "a smallish Brown Thrasher with its bill almost constantly agape rolling about on the exposed bed-rock by our platform feeder with flattened wings and fluttering at times". Great evidence was thus achieved for confirmed breeding in another 'square' of the Maritime Breeding Bird Atlas.

Larger than normal numbers of AMERICAN PIPITS were detected this fall, with a distinct movement in mid-October, especially on BPI. The first BOHEMIAN WAXWINGS were noted in early October, replacing CEDAR WAXWINGS that began to wane in late September. CAM and ALM were lucky to witness an enormous northward fly-by of an estimated 10,000 bohemians from Long Bch. to Donkin, *CBRM*. These birds were in flocks of 100-500 and were observed in steady movement for half an hour- "the sky was black with them and we could hear the noise of their wings." The Murrants commented they had never seen anything like it before.

An impressive 33 species of warbler were reported for this fall. TENNSSEE WARBLER sightings were up from the past few years. Most ORANGE-CROWNED WARBLER sightings started with the usual late September date, but a report in Dartmouth Aug. 22 would probably be among the earliest of fall sightings recorded for this species in NS.

In Milton, an ad. CHESTNUT-SIDED WARBLER was noted feeding young at a late Aug. 28 date (DPO). ELM noted that CAPE MAY WARBLERS were regular on Brier I. late August to early September after a virtual absence for many years. Through the Thanksgiving weekend large groups of YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLERS were found in the Canso, *Guys.*, CSI, BPI and Seal I. areas of the province.

The six reports of seven YELLOW-THROATED WARBLERS was a higher than normal number for this eastern U.S. species. PINE and PRAIRIE WARBLERS were noted in about average numbers with the pine not observed until late September, but the prairie reports were throughout the reporting period. There was a distinct movement of PALM WARBLERS in early to mid-October and in that movement, an above average number of the western variety were detected. The three **PROTHONO-TARY WARBLERS** were well seen and the Canso, *Guys*. bird photographed by TOK. There were no details submitted with the **WORM-EATING WARBLER** in Dartmouth.

There were only a couple of reports for OVENBIRD so most must have migrated undetected as they are still in good numbers as a breeding bird. NORTHERN WATERTHRUSH migration showed two peaks on the offshore islands. Aug. 23 good numbers were noted on Seal I., BPI and Brier I. A second movement was noted Sept. 5 on BPI. Once again the only **CONNECTICUT WARBLER** reports come from CSI where they are observed more often than anywhere else in the province. On the other hand, the **HOODED WARBLER** reports were mostly from HRM and the off-shore islands. The YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT reverse migration followed a similar pattern and numbers as recent years. Four were banded on Seal I. in September and three were banded on BPI this fall. ¤

## **Tanagers Through House Sparrows**

This fall fulfilled early predictions of a massive outpouring from the Boreal Zone because of poor crops of cones, seeds and berries. They found generally poor crops of cones, rowan berries, multiflora rose hips, etc. here as well. These were quickly cleaned out with the participation of waxwings. Another feature of this fall was the occurrence of much S.W. airflow as well as zonal winds across the continent that brought unusual numbers of both southern and western visitors.

The table below reveals distinct peaks of abundance among regular migrants and winter visitors, and the rarities largely speak for themselves, but some comments can be added.

Few AMERICAN TREE SPARROWS were reported; they nest largely beyond the Boreal Zone. This has been the biggest fall ever for CLAY-COLORED and VESPER SPARROWS, especially at Canso.

The peak of SAVANNAH (IPSWICH) SPARROW was late (early October in the 1970s); global warming? One junco at DAC's Dartmouth feeders (see photo) seemed to have features of two members of the "Oregon" group. Another curious little sparrow photographed at DAC's feeders seemed dwarfed and perhaps abnormal in other ways. It had a mixture of brown and streaked plumage, like a *Melospiza* sparrow, along with junco-like plumage, including a gray, but finely streaked, breast. Large flocks of SNOW BUNTINGS were widely noted, some on our beaches eliminating the Ipswich's primary fare of marram seeds.

It was a banner fall for reverse-migrant BLUE GROSBEAK and INDIGO BUNTING, with extraordinary numbers of the latter around Canso in mid-October. Interestingly, this was preceded by strong S.W. airflow offshore, backing to onshore winds on the N. mainland – reminiscent of the pattern preceding the Great Fallout in S. *Shelburne* in early October 1998.


The count of BOBOLINK near Kentville was reassuring, but JET noted that they no longer breed on the Wolfville dykelands, although a few still do so near Hortonville. Two flocks of RUSTY BLACKBIRD on Seal I. were the largest reported in some years. BALTIMORE ORIOLE was unusually common, no doubt brought by both zonal and S.W. airflow.

Although BLF had found 20 nests of AMERICAN GOLDFINCH by August, they were reported less frequently than the winter finches which, as predicted, appeared abundantly – with more PINE and EVENING GROSBEAKS than for some years. It was obviously shaping up to a "redpoll winter," probably larger the expected peak (two-year intervals on CBCs).

I wonder if the HOUSE SPARROW show in Lunenburg is a sign of some recovery. I for one miss them.^a




This junco, Nov. 1 at a Dartmouth feeder, is clearly of the "Oregon" subspecies group, probably a first-fall female judging from brown plumage on nape and crown on the original images. It can be distinguished from the nominal "Slate-colored" subspecies *cismontanus* of the Rockies (an intergrade zone with "Oregon") by the concave downward edge of the dark "hood." This is straight or concave upward in "Slate-colored" variants. The lores are darker and, on the original, the chestnut back and pinkish-buff sides are warmer-toned than on the usual vagrant "Oregon" here (*montanus* = *shufeldti*). Some members on the Colorado bird records committee, familiar with many kinds of juncos, have speculated that it might be an intergrade between "Pink-sided" and "Oregon," although breeding ranges of these don't overlap. # President's Report – 2007

Two major tasks occupied a good deal of the Board's time this past year. The first was finalizing the Agreement with the Nova Scotia Department of Natural Resources to make Hertford Island part of a proposed Wildlife Management Area, while leaving ownership and rights of access in our hands. This endeavour took two years and a seemingly endless stream of e-mails between all the parties involved. I'm pleased to announce that this Agreement has been signed, sealed, and delivered, by our lawyer, to DNR and we are now awaiting a public announcement from the Minister. A copy of the Agreement will be printed in the next issue (Autumn) of Nova Scotia Birds, and a few copies are available at the front of this room.

The second task was every bit as challenging. After the resignation of our Sanctuary and Scholarship Trust Fund members, a new Board had to be formed. A new Charter leading to the Special Resolution you are being asked to adopt this evening was indicated even before they stepped down. Our lawyer had already noticed that the original resolution creating the Sanctuary Trust in 1968 lacked clear definition; and DNR was having difficulty understanding their precise role in the proceedings. The former Trust members were involved in the preliminary work of drafting the new Charter, but the bulk of it was carried out by the Executive and the new acting Chairman of the Trust, Bob McDonald.

A new Trust Committee is now in place. Joining Bob McDonald are Mary Alward as Treasurer, Patrick Kelly as Secretary, George Digout as Director and Andy Horn as Director. Our thanks and our congratulations go out to all five new members. And a special thank you goes to Ken Gregoire who has agreed to be our first Sanctuary Warden.

Certificates of Appreciation have been prepared and delivered to the four retiring members: Ken Gregoire, Dave Currie, Shirley Cohrs and Peter Bell.

In other news, the Nova Scotia Bird Records Committee was finalized shortly after last year's AGM. Wayne Neilly joined Ian McLaren, Eric Mills, Dave McCorquodale, Richard Stern, Patricia Chalmers, and Andy Horn as the seventh member of this committee. They've had one official meeting, at which they appointed a Chair: Ian McLaren, and they produced an operational plan. They are working on the historical records from past issues of Nova Scotia Birds so as to authenticate the reported sightings. This is an essential first step before proceeding to current records. We wish them well in their efforts.

The Charitable Tax Receipt program is being offered again this year to Bird Society members who have accrued atlassing expenses. The claim form and travel log are available on our website and some forms are also available here tonight. Birders submit their expenses via these forms along with a cheque matching the amount claimed. This cheque constitutes a donation to the Bird Society. The expenses are then reimbursed by the Society and a Charitable Tax Receipt is issued for the donation. The net advantage for the claimant is the tax receipt.

Last year we ran a "Big Year" competition which was very successful. Tallies of the total number of species seen in the province throughout the year, as well as tallies of species seen in any individual county were submitted and posted in the winter issue of NS Birds. Johnny Nickerson of Cape Sable Island and Clarence Stevens of Dartmouth tied for first place with 236 species each! The biggest competition, however, turned out to be in the Counties! Cape Breton County and Halifax County tied with six submitted tallies each. Every county submitted at least one tally. This year, 2007, we are having a "Yard List" competition. I'll be asking you to submit your total number of species seen in your yard by January 15th, 2008. Results will be posted in our winter issue. For 2008 we're having a habitat creation competition. We'll be asking you to work individually or in teams to create a sanctuary for local birds. Descriptions and/or photos can be submitted. Sterling Levy, past President of the Nova Scotia Garden Club and a longtime member of the Bird Society has volunteered to judge the entries and select a winner. We'll be looking for sources of food, water, cover, nesting and roosting spots, as well as overall attractiveness. Size will not be a factor!

The Board has initiated a new program to encourage participation in Christmas Bird Counts. We will be covering one \$5.00 Audubon fee per Individual and Student membership, and two \$5.00 fees per Family membership. Detailed instructions will be issued in my "President's Corner " column in the next issue of our magazine.

Our out-of area meeting last May was combined with an Atlas Workshop and was held at Liscombe Lodge in Guysborough

County. It was so successful that we've decided to do it again next May in support of three regions: 17 - Southwest Shore, 18 - Lower South Shore, and 19 - Mersey–LaHave. Details are forthcoming.

We awarded five Certificates of Appreciation this year, and offered 48 field trips. We also redesigned our Life Member Certificates, and we're looking into having pins made for our Life Members.

A special thank you goes out to Peter and Linda Paysant who redesigned our website; to Bernice Moores for collecting and archiving back issues of our magazine; to Ralph MacLean for carving this year's Puffin; to Tony Robinson, our Honorary Solicitor, whose help with the Agreement and the Special Resolution was indispensable; and to Harold Forsyth, our Honorary Auditor, who provided excellent advice on both Bird Society finances and Sanctuary Trust finances. A huge thank you goes to all the people responsible for our quarterly publication, Nova Scotia Birds: Blake Maybank, our Editor, Sterling Levy, our copy and layout editor, Ian McLaren, our photo editor, Lance Laviolette, our records editor, all our seasonal editors, and of course, Peter LeBlanc who handles the mailings.

Most of all, I'd like to thank the members of the Executive. We've had a particularly challenging year, and everyone pulled together and gave generously of their time and expertise. David Hughes, our new Conservation Chair, has been very busy this past year. He's written several letters detailing our position on various issues, attended meetings, and is planning to form a Conservation Committee. Mary Alward, after putting in a second year of meticulous bookkeeping for the Executive, is stepping down as Treasurer in order to devote her talents as Treasurer of the new Sanctuary Trust. She also provided the refreshments at our monthly meetings. Janey Hughes has done a fantastic job as our Membership Secretary and will be taking over from Mary as Treasurer of the NSBS. Pat McKay has done an outstanding job as our Secretary, and has hosted most of our Executive meetings. Patrick Kelly has written a Privacy Policy for the Bird Society as well as setting up a database for volunteers. Susann Myers continues to be an invaluable member of the Executive by volunteering to be on several different committees and offering her insightful expertise on any number of issues. Her assistance on the wording of the Agreement is deeply appreciated. Jennifer (LeBlanc) Doucette got married and moved to Saskatchewan, but before she left she assisted me with coordinating field trips, for which I am truly thankful! Barbara Hinds was perhaps the greatest asset to the Executive this year. Her knowledge of the history of the Society provided much needed answers time and again. Andy Horn continues to offer counsel in his capacity as Past President. His advice and encouragement serve to remind me of all the great people who have held this office before me! And finally, our newest member of the Executive, by virtue of being the Chair of the Sanctuary Trust, Bob McDonald not only volunteered to take on this new position, but he jumped right in and joined a committee to help write the Special Resolution being presented this evening. We worked together as a team this year, offering support and encouragement to each other in all our endeavours. My thanks to each and every one of you for a most productive year!

# Autumn Migration at the Atlantic Bird Observatory: Fall 2007

Monitoring efforts commenced 16 August on Bon Portage Island (BP) and 15 August on Seal Island (SI). Overall, 72 species were banded, 153 were censused, and a grand total of 186 species were detected (both island sites combined).

Through constant-effort mist-netting, 1468 individuals (comprising 66 species) were banded on BP and 765 individuals (comprising 60 species) were banded on SI. The top ten species banded at BP are listed in Table 1, along with corresponding dates that peak movements were detected. Banding totals for the past six years are also presented for comparison.

On BP, movements of Traill's Flycatchers (likely all Alder Flycatchers *Empidonax alnorum*) and Yellow Warblers (*Dendroica petechia*) were observed on 28 August (approximately 40 and 45 individuals respectively). 6 September brought a small wave of Black-and-white Warblers (*Mniotilta varia*), American Redstarts (*Setophaga ruticilla*) and another wave of Traill's Flycatchers (approximately 35, 40, and 25 individuals respectively). Numbers of Black-and-white Warblers peaked on 14 September with approximately 80 individuals observed. Peak numbers of Cedar Waxwings (*Bombycilla cedrorum*), with approximately 110 individuals observed, occurred on 17 September.

Blackpoll Warbler (*D. striata*) numbers peaked on 29 September (approximately 100 individuals were observed) and Red-eyed Vireo (*Vireo olivaceus*) numbers peaked on 30 September, approximately 35 individuals were detected. Early October was marked by significant migratory movements of several species. Approximately 2800 Yellow-rumped Warblers (*D. coronata*) were observed on 7 October. Yellow Palm Warblers (*D. palmarum hypochrysea*) were also quite numerous during this period, approximately 200 individuals were observed between 7-9 October. Our first wave of Slate-colored Juncos (*Junco hyemalis*) and White-throated Sparrows (*Zonotrichia albicollis*) occurred 8 October with approximately 80 individuals observed for each species.

#### NOVA SCOTIA BIRDS

Approximately 30 Brown Creepers (*Certhia americana*) were noted on 8 October. Another wave of Slate-colored Juncos and White-throated Sparrows occurred on 17 October with similar numbers detected as during the first wave. American Pipits (*Anthus rubescens*) were very numerous during 14-19 October with approximately 1300 individuals observed.

Similar species-specific patterns were observed on SI, which typically involved fewer individuals. However, there were a few exceptions. White-crowned Sparrows (*Z. leucophrys*) were very numerous 17 October with approximately 120 individuals detected. This species was scarcely detected on BP. Additionally, Ruby-crowned Kinglets (*Regulus calendula*) were detected in higher numbers on SI. Approximately 120 individuals were observed, whereas on BP only 40 individuals were detected.

Numerous vagrant species were banded and spotted throughout the season (Table 2 & 3).

# Report on the 2007 Piping Plover Breeding Season in Nova Scotia

#### Good News & Bad for Piping Plovers in 2007

There was good news and bad news for endangered Piping Plovers on beaches in Nova Scotia this year. The good news was an increase in overall numbers of breeding pairs since 2006. Every year in early June, a two-week 'window count' is conducted on beaches to assess the breeding population. In 2007, 40 pairs were counted compared to 37 pairs in 2006. This is encouraging, but we still have a long way to go to reach the recovery target of 60 breeding pairs for Nova Scotia.

In 2007, 61 nests were monitored across the province, half of which hatched. Plovers in northern Nova Scotia had a fairly productive breeding season producing, on average, over two fledglings per pair. In contrast, southern Nova Scotia had another year of poor breeding success with an average of less than one fledgling per pair. The high rate of nest failure in southern NS (nearly two-thirds of nests failed) continues to hamper plover productivity in this region.


#### **Outreach & Volunteers in 2007**

Educational outreach was conducted on all but one plover beach in NS and volunteer involvement increased over 2006. In total, 69 people spent almost 1000 hours surveying beaches, protecting habitat, and sharing plover-friendly messages with beach goers. We tracked a 47% decrease in the proportion of off-leash dogs between the start and end of the plover breeding season. Volunteers also worked with program staff to protect a nest in Shelburne County from flooding using sandbags. This nest escaped the high tides and fledged 3 chicks.

Given these positive results, we're very excited about building our volunteer program and enhancing the role of volunteer Piping Plover Guardians in Nova Scotia. Through additional training, volunteers can assist with nest and chick monitoring in addition to ongoing education efforts on beaches. There are many challenges ahead to recover Piping Plovers and it will take a strong team, so please join us on the beach in 2008!

#### Bird Studies Canada's Nova Scotia Piping Plover Conservation Program

Bird Studies Canada (BSC) is a national, non-profit organisation dedicated to advancing the appreciation, understanding and conservation of birds and their habitats. #### Cape Breton Shorebirds 09 September 2007, Leader: Susann Myers

Nineteen Cape Breton birders met at Sydney airport at 09:00 on a clear fall day. We spent a productive hour birding on the airport runways, always a fun experience, with the generous help of the staff of the Sydney Airport Authority. Strong winds kept birds grounded and we had good looks at a variety of shorebirds that make use of this short-grass habitat, including 60 American Goldenplovers, Black-bellied and Semipalmated Plovers, Whimbrel, Buff-breasted Sandpipers, Killdeer, Pectoral Sandpipers, Short-billed Dowitchers, and a single Baird's Sandpiper. Other birds included a Northern Harrier and a Ruby-throated Hummingbird.

Due to the wind we avoided Schooner Pond Beach, and instead took advantage of the sheltered conditions at the Tower Road Settling Pond in Glace Bay, where ducks abound. Present that day were a pair of Wood Ducks, numerous Ring-necked Ducks, Green-winged and Blue-winged Teal, and a trio of Black Ducks.

We continued on to the sandbar at Port Morien, adding seven shorebird species to the day's tally. This is an excellent spot for shorebird viewing by a large group, as the birds are close at mid-tide and field marks can be compared and discussed. There were also eight non-shorebird species, bringing the day's tally to 37. We enjoyed a bountiful lunch at Morien Bar in warm sunshine and the good fellowship that is a trademark of Cape Breton field trips.

#### Antigonish Coastal Waters 25 Nov 2007, Leader: Randy Lauff

An even dozen birders shared a glorious autumn day to observe the bird life of coastal Antigonish County. It's not often that the trip leader gets a life bird on his own trip, but the highlight of the day for many of us (including being the lifer for me) was a **Prairie Warbler** at Williams Point.

We had at least 66 species for the group...sorry to disappoint those going for 75...Although Gannets were seen offshore, they were not in Ogdens Pond, which has sometimes been a highlight of this trip.

We had 19 species of ducks and geese, with Greater Scaup being notably absent. We had five raptors including a Barred Owl that hooted in response to the playback of a N. Saw-whet Owl. We also counted six species each of gull and sparrow.

A Marsh Wren was seen by one and heard by several. One Ruby-crowned Kinglet was probably wondering where all of its buddies were...

Finches were not abundant, but diverse...we only missed Pine Siskin of the expected finches, though some, like Purple Finch, were only seen at one feeder.

#### Metro "Hot Spot" Birding 01 Dec 2007, Leader: Terry Paquet

NSBS's Metro "Hot Spot" Birding fieldtrip was run in less than ideal conditions. Cold, intermittent, blowing snow and very windy conditions made for difficult birding at times. Highlights included:

Brookdale Crescent – 1 Orange Crowned Warbler, 1Yellow-throated Warbler, 1 Black-and-white Warbler
Day Ave - Yellow-breasted Chat, 2 Northern Cardinals
Clifford St - Yellow-breasted Chat, 2 Northern Cardinals
Dorothea Ave - Yellow-breasted Chat, 2 Northern Cardinals
Bissett Lake - 3 American Coots, 1 Pied-billed Grebe, 1 Ruddy Duck, Greater & Lesser Scaup, Ring-necked Ducks, and a Pine
Warbler.
Middle St - White-eyed Vireo

#### Sewer Stroll I 06 January 2008, Leader: Bob McDonald


Here is a report on places we visited and the highlights on Sunday's NSBS field trip:

- McCormack's Beach (Eastern Passage) -Iceland Gulls, but no Mew (Common) Gull seen, White-winged Scoter, Common Eider.
- Hartlen Point Rough-legged Hawk, Northern Harrier, and 2 adult Bald Eagles on Devils Island, Lapland Longspurs
  and a Horned Lark flying along the kelp beds. A flock of Snow Buntings flew over, and a Dovekie (far out).
- Dartmouth Cove (bottom of Old Ferry Rd) Double-crested Cormorant, Black Guillemot (at least 4), flock of Scaup (mostly Greaters with a few Lessers mixed in)
- Sullivan's Pond/Findley Park American Coot, Northern Flicker, Northern Cardinal.
- Birch Cove Park (lower parking lot) Pine Grosbeaks were heard flying over.
- Brookdale Crescent Orange-crowned Warbler (a very bright yellow bird), Yellow-throated Warbler (WOW! We lucked out on this one!), Brown Creepers.
- Pat McKay's (35 Edward St) Yellow-breasted Chat.
- Bedford Bay (mouth of the Sackville River) Barrows Goldeneye (M + F), and a Sharp-shinned Hawk circled over our heads.

Rather than visiting local Halifax hot-spots on the Peninsula we headed out to Chebucto Head. I'm delighted that we did. Never have I experienced such good conditions for observing from the lighthouse. Here we saw Razorbills (at least 15 birds and several quite close), Black-legged Kittiwakes, and a distant Common Murre (a life bird for NS for the leader!!). Thanks to Fulton for finding this one for us.

Although I had to head for home at 4:30 p.m. when we were asked to leave, others stopped at Herring Cove to pick up a Rednecked Grebe and another Dovekie.

All in all an excellent day with respect to the weather, the company and the birds. Birders from at least 6 counties were present including visitors from Cape Breton, Shelburne, Kings, Queens and Lunenburg. My checklist shows 62 species tallied by the group during the field trip.  $\alpha$
